Trooper Beat

On May 30, 2020 at approximately 7:04 p.m., Village Police Officers in Stebbins contacted the Alaska State Troopers to report that Richard Hunt, age 32 of Stebbins, Michael Raymond, age 23 of Stebbins, and Paul Pete, age 25 of Stebbins, had stolen two four wheelers and were threatening the VPO's and community members with steel pipes, an ax and an anchor. Hunt at-tempted to run several people over with the stolen four-wheeler. VPO's were able to detain and ar-rest Pete although Hunt and Raymond remained rest rete attnough Hunt and Haymono remained at large and caused significant damage to the store door while trying to break in. Hunt and Raymond went to the Public Safety building where Pete was held and assaulted the VPO as they forcefully broke Pete out of custody. Hunt, Raymond and Pete continued to threaten community members and VPO's. Prior to AST response, the community of Stebbins came together, and Hunt, Raymond, and Pete were ultimately arrested and being held with \$25,000, \$15,000, and \$10,000 bail. Investigation is ongoing and more charges are pending. Anyone with further information is encouraged to contact AST at 1-800-764-5525.

On June 1, 2020, the Bethel office of the Western Alaska Alcohol and Narcotics Team (WAANT) received information from a citizen that Samuel Davis, 31, of Elim had traveled to Anchorage and purchased large amounts of alcohol, marijuana bud and DABS. (DABS is a street slang for hashish, which is a marijuana concentrate and a Scheduled III Controlled substance under Alaska Statute.) Davis was intending to drive his boat from Fairbanks to Elim where he was intending to sell the alcohol, marijuana and DABS. To accomplish this, Davis would be traveling down the Yukon River and across a portion of Norton Sound. On June 3, 2020, the Nome WAANT office received information from a citizen source that Davis had arrived in Elim, a local option com-Davis, 31, of Elim had traveled to Anchorage and that Davis had arrived in Elim, a local option community that bans the importation and sale of al-coholic beverages. Bethel WAANT investigators applied for and were granted a search warrant for Davis' Elim residence. NOME WAANT, AST and AWT traveled to Elim and executed the search warrant which lead to the seizure of the following warrant which lead to the selzure or the following items: approximately 20L (5.28 gal) of distilled spirits, approximately 1,081 gross grams (2.38 lbs.) of marijuana bud, and approximately 665 gross grams (1.46 lbs.) of DABS.

The approximate Elim street value of the distilled

spirits is \$5,200, of the marijuana bud is \$54,050 and of the DABS is \$66,500. The boat used to transport the alcohol and controlled substance a 17- foot 2000 Key Largo 170 boat with a 115HP Yamaha motor, was also seized and transported out of Elim; the boat's estimated value is \$25,000. Davis was subsequently arrested and remanded at AMCC on the charges of MICS 3rd Degree (Hashish), MICS 4th Degree (marijuana), Alcohol Importation and License or Permit Required; Presumption concerning Possession for Sale. Davis is being held without bail pending arraignment.


