Nome ramp agent gets new Alaska Air recycling program to takeoff

In her job as an Alaska Airlines ramp agent in Nome, Caitlin Auktheenna “Auk” Tozier was regularly filling and loading water jugs to be used as ballast on cargo planes. Considering how hard it is to get materials out of the region, she wondered if there could be a better way to create necessary weight on the planes. Why not fill planes with heavy recyclables that can’t be processed locally instead?

Thanks to Tozier’s idea, Alaska Air Cargo launched a program this spring to carry up to 50,000 pounds of recyclable electronic waste, also known as e-waste, out of Nome each year. Tozier started working at the airline three years ago. Soon after, she asked the company about whether there might be alternatives to the water jugs she would have to fill multiple times each week. “One, it’s obnoxious to build if

you’re short on time, and two, I just didn’t see the point in sending weight back and forth,” she told the Nugget. Her request didn’t get to the right people at Alaska Air at the time. Tozier left the job for a few months and came back in January 2022, now newly determined to get more serious about pitching a ballast alternative. Tozier also works as a technology specialist at Kawerak, and she coordinated with the organization’s environmental program director

Anahma Shannon. Kawerak already works with Backhaul Alaska, a company that helps get e-waste out of rural Alaska communities. E-waste materials—such as old TVs, smartphones and laptops—often contain hazardous materials like lead and mercury that would be dangerous if left in unlined landfills or burned with other trash. That’s an especially worrying prospect in a place that relies heavily on subsistence. Tozier emailed an environmental director of Alaska Air and proposed a partnership with Kawerak. They tried a test run last fall, and now the program has begun in earnest, with Kawerak selecting and sorting the waste and dropping it off to be loaded on Alaska Air freighters.

“Now we’ve loaded quite a bit of e-waste ballast in place of water ballast,” Tozier said. She hopes the idea might spur other partnerships in other rural communities. “I’m really excited because there’s another ramper in Juneau who emailed me and one in King Salmon,

asking, “How can we get going in our station?”” she said. For now, the program only includes e-waste, but Tozier wondered if other materials would make sense for other communities to send out. King Salmon has a lot of old fishing net waste, for example. Alaska Airlines commended Tozier in a press release about the new tactic, which the company said will also save more than 6,000 gallons of local water each year.

The program will not only help get recyclable waste out of Nome but also the surrounding villages that rely on Nome as a hub.

“Our rural terminals don’t have the same resources as our bigger terminals companywide,” Tozier said in the press release. “We are responsible for bringing a lot of consumables into the community, [and we need to take responsibility] so they don’t all end up in the landfills, which are running out of space.”

Man arrested for brutal assault in front of Visitor Center

Nome police arrested Kenneth Smith on June 23, after having been called out to respond to a report of an assault. According to a police affidavit filed with a criminal complaint in the Nome Court, three officers responded to the scene at the Visitor Center and saw Smith, although restraint by bystanders, trying to kick a person on the ground. Smith was arrested and placed inside the police patrol vehicle. According to the affi-

davit, officers turned to the injured and unconscious man on the ground and saw blood coming from his lips and eyebrow, his face swelling and having seizures. The affidavit goes on to report that “due to no medical responders from the Nome Volunteer Ambulance Department for 30 minutes, the male was transported to the hospital using a piece of plywood found nearby and a police vehicle.” Investigator Crockett reviewed camera footage that showed the assaults, showing Smith approaching

the victim three separate times, each time stepping on him and kicking him repeatedly. He also appeared to reach into the victim’s pocket and removing an item and putting it in his pocket. Smith was charged with three counts of assault in the first degree and one count of robbery. He was arraigned on June 24 and is held on a \$50,000 cash bail plus a third-party custodian requirement.
