identifying and tracking that plankton is important because fish prey is shifting as water warms, ice retreats and the potential for harmful algal blooms increases, Mooney-Seus said.

The report also recommends more use of Indigenous knowledge and cites the value of cooperation with

communities, tribes, multiple government agencies and international organizations like the North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission. Anadromous fish are those like salmon that swim up rivers to spawn.

A key international player in Alaska's salmon fortunes is Russia. The report includes salmon data from Russia, and it notes that large

amounts of hatchery fish are released into the Bering Sea from Russia. Despite the breakdown in U.S.-Russia relations that followed Russia's invasion of Ukraine, there is still some cooperation with Russia through the North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission, said Ed Farley, task force's chair and the ecosystem monitoring and assessment program

manager at the Alaska Fisheries Science Center.

"This collaboration is ongoing and is why we are able to provide hatchery release and salmon catch data from Russia," Farley said by email.

Russian colleagues participated virtually and made presentations at a

workshop last month in British Columbia on climate warming and its impact on salmon, he said.

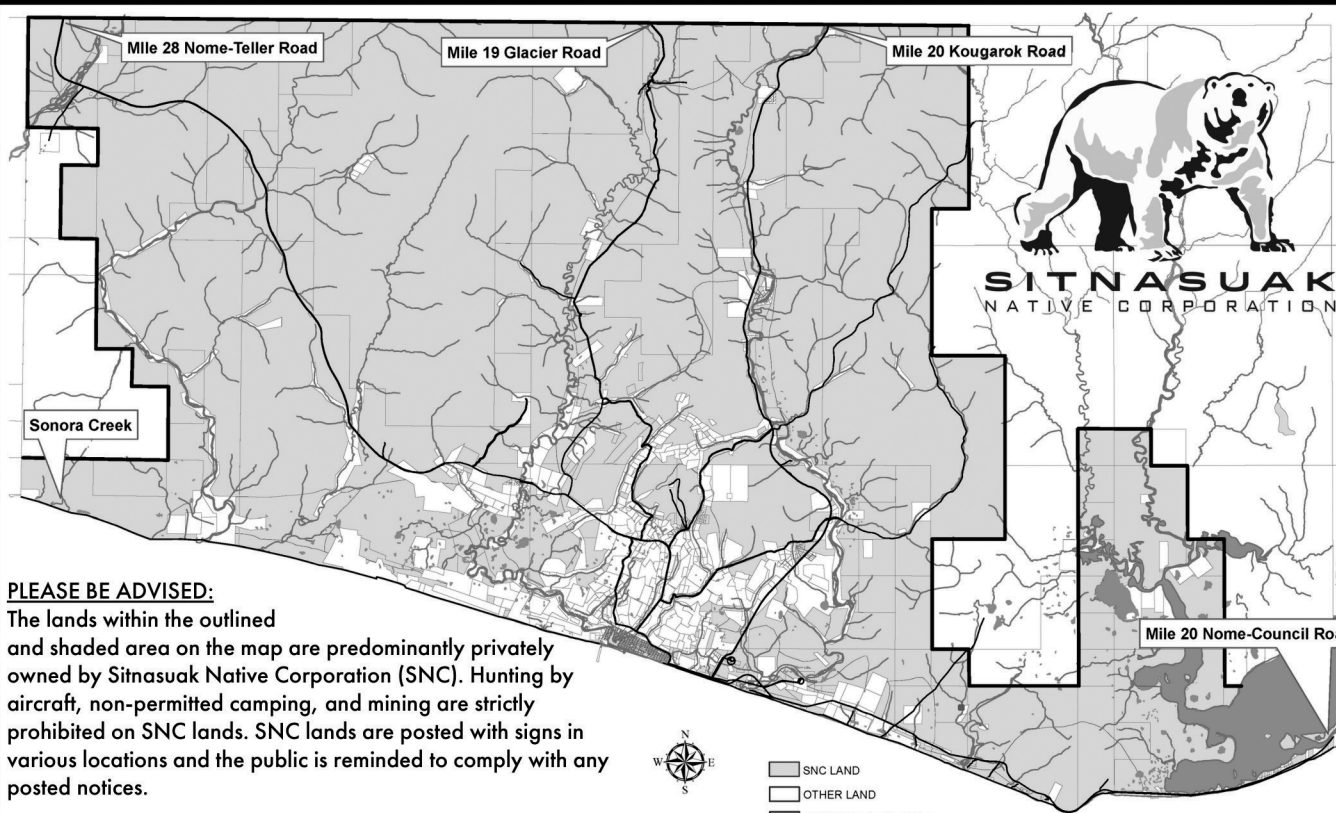
